DAY CAMP DETAILS

Camp Theme/Info: Our camp theme this year is Fairy tale; Where every scout writes her own story! Let your imagination soar as we explore our own storybook world through crafts, game play and activities. We'll end the week with a Royal Ball, including visits from local queens and princesses!

Program Activities: Activities at camp are designed to help girls develop a strong sense of self, develop positive values, seek challenges, develop healthy relationships, learn about community problem solving, and make the world a better place.

Day Camp Unit: Day Camp is a "Beyond-the-Troop Experience." Girls are placed in their unit by grade level. Day camp is an opportunity to meet new friends and try new experiences. While they might not be in a unit with their entire troop, there will be opportunities at camp to be together. Campers will be contacted prior to day camp to be made aware of their unit number, unit leader (PA), and any additional supplies needed.

What To Wear: A short-sleeve T-shirt and shorts (shirts should provide full coverage of stomach and back), gym shoes with a closed toe and heel (no sandals or clogs), and socks. Old clothes and shoes are the best.

Weather: To ensure safety of all attendees, camp may be called off due to severe weather after the girls have arrived. **Please be sure your contact person will be available in the event that the camp is evacuated.**

Contacting Caregivers Procedure: We hope we don't need to call you during camp. In case of illness or accident, please keep your phone at hand. Ensure emergency contact information is filled out in the Camper Release Form if you cannot be available.

Health: A nurse or certified First Aider will be at camp at all times. Check with your physician to make sure tetanus/all immunizations are up to date for your daughter. Ensure that any allergies, dietary restrictions, and medical conditions are recorded on your child's "Health History Form" and pointed out at check-in.

Medication: Any over-the-counter or prescribed medications must be in the original container, labeled with child's name, and sent to the day camp nurse with written instructions on dosage and time to be administered. In certain cases, such as inhalers (which must be with the camper at all times), a note of necessity must be on file with the camp nurse.

Food: Snack will be provided. On Friday, supper will be provided at camp. There will be juice and doughnuts for breakfast on Saturday morning.

Transportation: Transportation to and from camp is the parents/caregiver's responsibility. Carpools are strongly encouraged! When dropping off or picking up your campers please obey all traffic personnel and drive SLOWLY. If the camper will be picked up by someone other than the parents/caregivers, please make sure they are listed on the "Camper Release and Health History Form" and inform your troop's adult helper of the change.

Check-In Procedures: Please do not arrive more than 15 minutes early to camp. When girls are dropped off at camp they report directly to the PA(s) in charge of their Unit. Sit patiently until everyone arrives. Camp will start with a flag ceremony. Each unit will get an opportunity to participate in a flag ceremony during the week.

Check-Out Procedures: At the end of the day the PAs will line up their campers at the flag. A group song will be sung and we will perform a closing flag ceremony. The campers will then line up for pick-up.

Photography: NOTICE OF FILMING AND PHOTOGRAPHY

By attending a Girl Scouts of Western Ohio event, you enter an area where photography and audio/video recording may occur. By entering the premises, you consent to photography, audio/video recording and its release of publication, exhibition or reproduction by GSWO and its affiliates and representatives and you waive rights to claims of payment or royalties for its use. You have been fully informed of your consent, waiver of liability, and release before entering the event. If any child or adult does not consent to being in photos or videos, you must let your camp director know at the event check-in.

Overnight Information: Friday night is the overnighter. Tents are not provided by day camp. You must bring your own tent to stay the night. Each troop staying must have at least one adult per six girls staying overnight, minimum two. Campers wake Saturday morning and clean up camp. Breakfast will be provided and closing ceremony ends camp.

PA Training: Girl Scout Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors (entering grades 7 through 12) must complete a LiA award, as well as their Program Aide Training before camp begins.

Volunteer: Volunteers are always needed for day camp. If you have not signed up yet to help, contact the day camp director. Volunteer training is mandatory for any adult who wishes to volunteer at camp and will be held at the beginning of camp on Wednesday, June 17, 2026.

Keeping Girls Safe: Girl Scouts has over 100 years of experience in providing excellent, safe camps for girls. We will do everything to make sure your camper has a great experience this year.

Reporting Child Abuse: Girl Scout Volunteers and Staff are mandatory reporters of suspected child abuse. If you suspect child abuse, call 855.642.4453. Detailed information is available in Volunteer Essentials.

Refund Policy: Money may be refunded for the following reasons only:

1. Moving out of town.
2. Required attendance at summer school.
3. Illness (Doctor's note required.)
4. Camp capacity is full.

Packing Lists

What to Bring in a Backpack Daily:

Label everything with your camper's name and troop

- Water Bottle
- Rain Gear
- Sunscreen
- Bug Repellent
- Mess Kit (plastic plate, bowl, cup, fork, and spoon)
-put all in a mesh bag (laundry bag/potato sack)
- Sit upon (mat or bucket). Items can be put in a five-gallon bucket with lid. The bucket will keep all your belongings together and keep them dry. It is also a seat while eating. You can fashion a cushion for the top. *New Leaders/new to day camp—local businesses will sometimes donate these buckets: Wal-Mart, bakeries, Community Market, area restaurants. You can also buy five-gallon buckets at a hardware store or Wal-Mart.

For the Overnighter:

- Tents (some Girl Scout leaders take care of this item—please check with yours in advance)
- Sleeping bag and/or blanket
- Pillow
- Flashlight
- Pajamas
- Toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, brush and comb, deodorant, etc.)
- Washcloth and hand towel
- Clothes for Saturday
- Campers may also bring a few books or small games to play after evening activities are finished

PA's staying the week:

In addition to the overnighter list:

Yes, you will be showering every night! bring:

- Bath towel(s)
- Soap (shampoo, conditioner, body)
- Razor
- **Deodorant**
- Clothes for all week, including pajamas—remember no sandals, short shorts or tank tops during camp time! Clothing should be Girl Scout appropriate!!
- Phone charger
- Snacks
- —More details will be emailed the week prior to camp if necessary

Also, it usually rains:

- Bring your belongings in a plastic tub to keep them dry (ex. 18 gallon)
(Just in case your tent leaks. LOL....)
