

Girl Scouts of Western Ohio Facility Resources—Camp Libbey



Sweet Breeze Cluster or other wise known as Susan B Anthony Lodge, Elizabeth Blackwell Lodge and Sojourner Truth Lodge are located towards the front of camp near the administration building. Each of these full seasoned buildings is equipped with a kitchen, bathroom and separate sleep area with bunk beds that sleep 16 and has a great room with fire place.



Linden House, with its older architecture and seclusion gives it a charm all its own. Built in 1939, it is the oldest building at Camp Libbey and has been updated to include a modern bathroom and kitchen facility as well as a fireplace in the great room. This building is handicapped accessible and sleeps 28 persons.



Woodland Lodge is a large group facility equipped with full kitchen, bathroom/shower areas and a great room with fireplace. This year-round facility has floor length windows on the east and west side of the building, which gives the great room an open and airy feeling.



Woodland Units is connected by sidewalks to the east are five separate modern buildings which can be used year round. Set in a beautiful ravine area with windows overlooking a natural, undisturbed view of the woods, each of the buildings sleeps eight.



Juliette Low Lodge, found near the front of the camp, is located amidst a cluster of trees. This lodge is one of the largest sleeping units in camp and an ideal setting for large troops. There are two dormitories on either side of the building which sleeps 16 in bunk beds, with each side having its own bathroom with showers. The center of the building has a large meeting area with fireplace, a separate kitchen and preparation center.



Watzi, Jakata, Sherwood and Frontier are platform tent units on the far northeast side of camp. Each of the tent units has a one sided cooking shelter with fireplace, picnic tables, outdoor fire ring and a modern bath/shower house. Watzi tent unit sleeps 40 persons whereas Jakata, Sherwood and Frontier all sleep 36. Sherwood also is wheelchair accessible.

Skandy Primitive Unit is located east of the main camp entrance off Highway 281 and is accessible by road or by back packing in from a path located south east of the dining hall. The hike takes you down and up a nice size ravine leading to the unit, which has a shelter house with a raised fire ring and picnic benches. This camp site has no tents or equipment so these items must be brought with any group wishing to use this site.

The **Administrative Building** houses the camp office, Trading Post, health center when camp is in session, storm shelter and two conference rooms that can be reserved for program space. The large conference room holds 75, has a small stage and can be set up with tables and chairs. The small conference room holds 50 and can also be set up with tables and chairs. Both rooms, located in the basement of the administrative building, are accessible by elevator. Room reservation and costs are available upon request.



The **Dining Hall** is set in a wooded environment and is fully equipped with a commercial kitchen, fireplace and bathroom facilities. This year-round facility has a large porch which extends across the front of the building with two major entrances into the hall. The dining hall holds 200 people, 25 tables of eight persons each.
