Facility Descriptions—Woodhaven Program Center



Rose Marie Duffy Lodge, built in 1987 is a 5,000 square foot building that can be used year-round. This facility provides a beautiful atmosphere to host receptions, large meetings and conferences and can accommodate 200 persons. Additionally the building can be walled off into three meeting rooms, has a large deck, entry reception area and has a full commercial kitchen.



Originally a log cabin built in 1946 then moved to the current location in 1948, **Sweetbriar Lodge**, has undergone transitions through the years. The main part of the lodge, rustic in feeling, has multiple size meeting rooms, stone fireplace, hardwood floors, large windows and separate fully equipped kitchen, dining area and

bathrooms. The dormitory part of the building is framed walls with an earthen roof that can sleep 50 persons. There are two dormitories, three restrooms, double showers in two main restrooms and two greenhouses. The Solar Program Center was built in 1981 and serves as a program resource at this property. In addition, this unique building serves as the tornado shelter for the Program Center.



Shagbark Lodge, a multi-purpose three-room building, is used for program activities and nature observation.

Behind Shagbark lodge is the **Amphitheater** with fire ring and the **Observation Tower**.
